LOCATION:

The subjects are located in the town of Tayport, in the northeast of Fife. It lies 11 miles north of St Andrews, approximately 5 miles north of Leuchars and 5 miles southeast of Dundee, both of which benefits from a railway station on the East Coast Main Line.

The subject is situated on the western side of Queen Street, at its junction with King Street, a short walk from the local primary school and library.

DESCRIPTION:

The Picture House opened around 1911 and was the second cinema acquired by J B Milne in the 1930's as he built his circuit into what was eventually one of the largest privately owned cinema chains in the UK. The subjects comprise a picture house of traditional stone construction, beneath a combination roof (asbestos and slate). It has a main auditorium and entrance hallway on the ground floor and projector/storerooms on the first floor.

Internally, the property is in a state of some disrepair and the building has been used for storage purposes. The property could benefit from extensive renovation or serve as a development opportunity.

ACCOMMODATION:

The property has been measured in accordance with RICS Code of Measuring Practice - 6th Edition on a net internal basis and is as follows:

450.07 sq m (4,842 sq ft) on a gross internal basis.

According to the Scottish Assessors' Association website, the subjects are noted to have a Rateable Value of £6,600 per annum.



The Volunteer Drill Hall

This building was once used by the community for a wide range of public gatherings and events, including concerts, lectures, early film screenings and even a boxing contest. In 1902, local MP and future Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. H. H. Asquith, delivered a speech here, in which he drew cheers with his reference to the recent conclusion of the South African War. March 1907 saw Tayport Choral Society perform "KING ARTHUR with Orchestral Accompaniment" with the notable artist Frank Laing among the soloists.

The Picture House

In earlier days, "Grand Cinematograph Entertainments" were held in the Temperance Hall, but after the former Volunteer Hall was put up for sale in 1930. it became the town's cinema. The Picture House officially opened on the 20th October 1931 and, with the exception of a period of closure after a fire in June 1946, continued in use until 1968. The final screening on 30th August that year, was "The Sand Pebbles", starring Steve McQueen. The 453 seat Picture The Picture House left lasting memories of the hard front seats and poster for i elevated balcony, the long queues and friendly staff.

Local Groups & Societies

Since the mid 19th century, there has been a rich history of local organisations devoted to music and drama, including brass bands along with dramatic, orchestral, choral and literary societies. Today that tradition is maintained by both Tayport Instrumental Band, first established in 1890 and now based in the former Parish Church Hall in Maitland Street, and Tayport Amateur Dramatic and Musical Society, founded in 1949 and still active in both Newport and Tayport.



Youth Organisations

Youth groups have also played their part in the town. In 1910, the Boys Brigade began meeting every Tuesday in the Volunteer Hall and the Girl Guides were active throughout most of the 20th century. In 2021, the 37th Fife (Ist Tayport) Scout Group was the only remaining uniformed organisation. Based in their Elizabeth Street premises since 1931, they now cater for both boys and



The town motto "Te Oportet Alte Ferri" was created by the internationally renowed academic Douglas Young (1913-1973) as an appropriately punned historic reference "It behoves thee to bear thyself loftily". Tayport has a rich history of verse & drama composed and performed in recognition of local events such as the Centenary Concert in 1987.
